Dear Parents / Carers,

Please find below a list of resources and activities which are available for you to use to continue with your child's learning at home.

- Go on a coin hunt and collect all of the different coins in your house. Can you sort them into different types and talk about how much they are worth? Can you make a shop with your toys and practise buying things with the coins.
- Junk modelling- what can you build with bottles and boxes?
- Choose an animal that you love, use the internet and books to find out facts about the animal. Find out whether it comes from an egg, how it grows, what it eats, where it lives, how big it is etc. Choose how to record what you have found out e.g poster, booklet, video, model.
- Write a message to your teacher using Class Dojo, maybe you could send them a photo? Your teacher may write back.
- Choose a recipe and help a grown up to bake it. See if you can be in charge of the measuring and pouring. Can you read the recipe book and measure the ingredients carefully?
- Ask a grown-up to show you how to make paper aeroplanes - go outside and test them. Measure the distance with a tape measure- which one goes the furthest?
- Make an obstacle course outside. What can you use to travel over, under and through? Time yourself to complete the course using a grown-up's phone. Can you improve your time?
- Draw, paint or make a model of a Spring flower.
- Go outside for a walk and notice signs of Spring. Take photos or draw what you find.
- Can you build a den? Use sheets and pegs to make an awesome den. Once you have finished, take a photo and put it on Tapestry. Can you make a sign for your den?
- Ask your family to get out old photos and talk about the photos. What was different when they were younger? How have things changed?

Please continue to read your child's reading book with them, practise the high frequency words attached plus the ones which have already been sent home, practise reading forwards and backwards the numbers 0-20. Please practise the Phase 2 and Phase 3 phonics sounds. You could play some games where your child needs to show you the correct sound or write the correct sound. Can they think of more words with that sound in? Can they write those words?

Every day at school your child takes part in lessons and activities to recap, review and apply their skills in writing, reading, numbers. They also listen to stories and join in with songs and rhymes every day. Please continue to practise these skills at home.
