Staying Safe

- Encouraging social distancing for all
- Re-arrangement of furniture to support social distancing
- No whole school assemblies. Assemblies are being taken in children's bubbles
- Windows and doors open in classrooms as much as possible to maintain airflow
- Children having their own stationery pack
