A message from Mr Hodgson

This week, we shared with you a virtual tour of your child's classroom and with it, a little insight into some of the learning focusses over this term. This short video is to complement the written summary (mini report) we sent out last Friday. Remember, if you want to discuss any of the content with your child's class teacher, please get in touch by contacting the school office or by giving a message to the staff on the morning, at the gate.

In your child's class video, many of the teachers shared with you the planets for 'Read for the Stars' and the reading corners in the classroom. Reading is so important and is why we really encourage your children to read outside of school.

Read for the Stars

To reinforce our home reading initiative, we ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early Years and Key Stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week). We would love children to read more than 1 book/chapter a night at home but they will only have 1 stamp a day recorded in their reading rocket card.

They work their way through the planets until they reach the sun and then as a reward for their enjoyment of books (and their work), they will receive a certificate and book of their choice in assembly (and their star on our display).
