Our nursery is able to offer 30hrs of free childcare and education for those who are eligible. In September 2019 we will have 13 places available.

You can usually get 30 hours free childcare if you (and your partner, if you have one) are:

- in work or getting parental leave, sick leave or annual leave
- each earning at least the <u>National Minimum Wage or Living Wage</u> for 16 hours a week this is £125.28 if you're over 25
