Reading and a love of reading is so, so important which is why we, at Bader Primary School promote this and encourage it so much. Our 'Read for the Stars' home reading initiative works like this: We ask that children read a minimum of 4 times a week in Early years and Key stage 1 and 5 times a week in Key Stage 2 (up to the maximum of seven times a week).

A raft of successful readers this again week, well done to **Holly Fox, Gracie Dollard, Desirae Davies and Katie McGrath** for reaching the sun for the second time and also, well done to **Isla Jackson, Cody Burnham and Alfie Wright** for reaching the sun for the first time.

Attendance


Good Attendance and Punctuality = Good Learning
