Our Learning:

Alongside child initiated play, we will be using a range of topics to support and extend the children's learning.

We will also be learning about our Bader Values and how they link to the wider community.

Read for the Stars:

We ask that children in Reception read at least 4 times a week. Every time your child reads, they will move forward on the planets. Your child rewarded for their love of reading. Please make sure you record in your child's reading record when they have read.



Birthdays:

We are a healthy school and a nut free school. Due to this, you will not be able to send any birthday cakes or treats into Reception if it is your child's birthday. On your child's birthday, all the children will sing 'Happy Birthday' and your child will receive a card from school.



Every Friday, Reception children will take part in their PE lesson. Children need to bring their PE kit in a bag with their name on each item of clothing. PE uniform is plain black shorts/jogging bottoms, green PE t-shirts (available to purchase from school) and plimsoles. As the weather gets colder, children will need to wear jogging bottoms and a plain black long sleeved jumper or hoodie.



The outdoor classroom is just as important as the indoor classroom. We use the outdoor classroom daily to support the children's development. Please ensure the children come to school dressed appropriately for the weather and bring labelled wellington boots.
