Christmas is an important festival in France.

Many French people have Christmas trees in their houses, decorated with lights and ornaments.

In France, children often leave their shoes by the fireplace or under the Christmas tree, for Father Christmas to fill with sweets and small toys.

Christmas celebrations continue until the first Sunday in January when the arrival of the three Wise Men is commemorated.

The Galette des Rois (King Cake) is eaten in France to celebrate the arrival of the three Kings.

Sticky Knowledge

Words do not always have a direct equivalent in English,
eg Je vais is a verb meaning, I am going.
In this case, 2 words in French = 3 words in English.

I am going to play basketball.



Je vais faire du jogging-
I am going jogging.

Twenty-one, thirty-one, forty-one, fifty-one, etc are different.

They are formed by adding another word, et, which means and.
