Sticky Knowledge

Only one of these items is feminine-une gomme.

Des ciseaux-The letter c is pronounced as s. The letter string **eau**, is pronounced the same way as in the words gâteau and bateau.

Je n'ai pas... Je n'aime pas....

n'.....pas go around the verb to make the sentence negative.

Usually, the negative parts are **ne.....pas**.

The **e** is dropped from **ne** as the verb starts with a vowel.

Un means a, and une means a.

Un is used in front of masculine nouns.

Une is used in front of feminine nouns.

An s is added to the end of most nouns, to make them plural.

Two nouns that don't follow the rule are:

Un oiseau-deux oiseaux, une souris-deux souris (no need to add another s).

Christmas is an important festival in France.

Many French people have Christmas trees in their houses, decorated with lights and ornaments.

In France, children often leave their shoes by the fireplace or under the Christmas tree, for Father Christmas to fill with sweets and small toys.

Christmas celebrations continue until the first Sunday in January when the arrival of the three Wise Men is commemorated.

The Galette des Rois (King Cake) is eaten in France to celebrate the arrival of the three Kings.

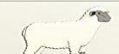

Sticky Knowledge

Letters of the alphabet may be pronounced differently in French compared to English.

Tricky letters to remember are: **i, j, q, r, y**.

It is important to be able to spell in a foreign language-to spell the name of a town, to give and receive an email address etc.

Sticky Knowledge

Some French words for furniture are similar to English words, but they may be pronounced differently.

In French, there are 2 ways of talking to other people: in a familiar way- with friends, and in a formal way with people you don't know very well. This affects the words you use in a sentence.

If you are talking to a friend, you would say: Répète, s'il te plaît (Please repeat).

To someone you don't know very well, you would say: Répétez, s'il vous plaît (Please repeat).

The position of the accent influences the pronunciation of individual letters.
